- 26. Get your fellow members to wear blue and gold/yellow ribbons to work along with a sticker or button that says "Ask Me About Civitan."
- Ask an electronics store to show a Civitan video on their TV monitors when there is heavy retail traffic.
- 28. Sometimes high school clubs allow speakers at their meetings check into that and if so, go speak or get someone who has benefitted from your club's service to speak.
- 29. Log onto your local radio stations' web sites and put your info on their online event calendars. Many times, the promotions people from these radio stations take information directly from those calendars to use in voiced PSAs.
- 30. Spend a little money to boost a post off your club's Facebook page.
- Get your local high school or college television class to feature Civitan in their next newscast. Treat them as a regular media outlet.
- Start a blog about service in your community. Put pictures on there and regularly update the blog. Encourage members to follow it.
- 33. Get your local school lunchrooms to serve something blue or gold in honor of Civitan on the day of your fundraising event or the week before. You could even see if they'll give you a portion of the proceeds. An example would be blue jello or a blue slushie. Make sure posters are up promoting the fundraiser.
- 34. Get some Civitan balloons. Blow them up, attach info about the next club event, and give them away at a community event.
- 35. Get your local drug store to staple a small flyer to their prescription bags about Civitan. Of course, this works best with local mom and pop stores.
- 36. Ask the local bank if you can use their marquee sign for the week to advertise Civitan or a related event.
- 37. Make a big display outside of your meeting place with blue balloons and such to invite people into the event. Maybe even put a banner outside that says "Come inside to help us support people with disabilities."
- 38. Decorate the office of a Civitan member who is doing a great job. In turn it will create awareness.
- Make sure your event is listed in your hometown newspaper's local calendar of events section.
- 40. See if your local church will let you post Civitan info in the Family Life Center or any other gathering place.
- 41. A group of Civitans can donate their time to the school's Fall Festival or Spring Carnival. Make sure they wear Civitan gear!
- 42. Ask the local school principal for permission to hold a special pep rally or mention Junior Civitan at the next pep rally.
- 43. Place door hangers at the dormitories of your college or university to promote Campus Civitan.
- 44. Whatever sport is in season, get athletes to wear a special blue and gold armband. This can be done on the community sports level, or even the high school level.
- 45. Make bookmarks that have "Save the Date" information on them. See if your local library will put these in the books that are checked out.
- 46. Post pictures from last year's fundraising event on your Facebook page to generate interest about this year's event. Encourage other members to do the same.
- 47. Somehow get Civitan incorporated into your local high school's "Spirit Week" which is usually around Homecoming. They're already doing things like "Wear Your Pajamas" Day so why not wear Blue and Gold Day?
- 48. Be sure to send out a newsletter! You can even send them to people who aren't a part of Civitan—possibly distributing them in a local community paper or through a local business.
- 49. Ask a local "Mom and Pop" restaurant if you can decorate their restaurant for one night with all things blue and gold like tablecloths. Also put table toppers on each table, detailing your service or fundraising event.
- 50. Work with other members to make signs and distribute them to members' front yards or business fronts.





Toronto Lung Transplant Club Has a Vision

Our vision is for Canada to be a forerunner in organ and tissue donation and transplantation – saving lives, improving quality of life and providing much needed care and support.

The Toronto Lung Transplant Civitan Club (TLTCC) provides dynamic outreach programs and services to pre and post lung transplant patients and their caregivers. The other main mandate of the club is to increase organ donation awareness and to actively work to secure the commitment of the general public to give the gift of life and become organ donors. There are currently more than 1500 people on the waiting list for a life saving organ transplant.

The TLTCC is an active volunteer non-profit organization founded in 1999 by a group of lung transplant recipients and caregivers who wanted to give back to their community in appreciation of the gift of life they had received. Together with friends, family and volunteer support networks, they formed the Toronto Lung Transplant Civitan Club Inc. #3453 as a chapter of the Community Service Club volunteer organization Civitan International.

Our members share a special bond, having all been touched in some way by transplantation. While they have their own unique story to tell, they are part of a team that serves to celebrate and cherish the greatest gift of all – life itself.

Over a period of ten years, TLTCC has participated in and conducted various donor awareness fund raising events that have enabled us to provide temporary relocation accommodations, acquire and distribute specialized equipment required by post lung transplant recipients and provide other forms of assistance to lung transplant candidates.

TLTCC continues to fulfill its mission and to grow and provide more financial help to a growing list of incoming lung transplant candidates while remaining equally committed to promoting donor awareness.

TLTCC works in the areas of advocacy, awareness and support. Our objectives are to:

- Increase the rate of organ and tissue donation;
- Improve the community's understanding of organ and tissue donation and transplantation;
- Provide transplant patients with support, education and guidance to improve their health and quality of life.

Blackwell from London and P/G Deb Hiscott for Yeoman work in the kitchen to assist Civitan Marie and her


crew.





D 0100- 14- BACKGROUND CHECK

Background Check Requirement for Individuals Involved with Anyone Who Has Not Reached the Age of Majority or classified as a Special Needs person.

ADOPTED: 02/19 LAST AMENDED:

Any Civitan or non-Civitan who has reached the age of majority, whom interacts with individuals whom have not reached the age of majority in a Civitan sponsored activity, shall be required to submit to a background check every two years to include these minimum requirements:

- Government Verification of identity
- Address History
- National Criminal History Database Search
- Sex Offender Registry Search
- Local Criminal Search



The following positions or individuals shall submit to a background check:

- International directors
- International candidates
- International Director liaison
- District Junior Civitan chair
- Sponsoring Club liaison (s)
- Club advisor
- Chaperones
- Sno-Do volunteers
- Dance-a-thon volunteers
- Civitan International staff



The individual, sponsoring Civitan club or district shall bear the cost of the background checks.


